



dot dot dot dot - in case you were wondering what that was that was big newsroom noise announcing a fantastic news break. As most of you know Ralph's Saturday Night -Sunday Morning album has been receiving plenty of airplay around the world. He is also #1 across the Nation.

Ralph Stanley was nominated for not one, not two, but three Grammy Awards this year. They were County Collaboration, with Ralph and Dwight Yoakam, for Miner's Prayer, which is the first time a Bluegrass performer has ever been in the County category, Best Bluegrass Album of the Year, and Gospel Album of the Year. This is a honor for anyone in the music field. It makes me proud to know that a man like Ralph has finally been recognized for his place in the music field. His music is as pure and clean as the mountain air and strong and powerful as the four winds that blow. He is the heart and soul of Mountain Music.

On the Grammy show Dwight won Male Vocalist and during his acceptance speech he stated that he was nominated for another Grammy with a legend in Country Music, Ralph Stanley. and he was as honored for that nomination more than anything in his career. He thanked Ralph for recording

that song.

OTHER NEWS

The Bear Family has released a new two CD set "The Stanley Brothers & The Clinch Mountain Boys, 1953-58 & 1959". This includes all the Mercury masters and two Blue Ridge cuts. The other I mentioned before in a previous newsletter which was "The Stanley Brothers, The Early Starday/King Years, 1958-1961" and I believe that these are available on

cassette also. I know that County Sales is handling these but Elderly Music may be too. You can call or write them and see. These are a must have collection as all of the previous material is unavailable to buy, unless you are lucky enough to have the originals on hand.

I hear through the grapevine that Ralph and Ralph II are making plans for another album. There's nothing like seeing family singing together. Who knows someday we may see Nathan (Ralph's grandson) singing along with Ralph and Ralph II. If Ralph keeps training all those children he'll have enough to start a whole Stanley family band.

The Clinch Mountain Boys made a trip out to California while their boss was on tour out there to join him for two shows in Berekley and Pasadena Cal. Ralph II also made the trip with them.

While out west Dwight Yoakam made a special appearance at one of Ralph's shows. Now there's a boy that hasn't gotten above his rasing. He took time out of his busy schedule to do a number or two with one of his heros. I bet that brought the house down. He'll be the first to tell you that Ralph Stanley is his favorite.

Ralph also did a spot in Dwight's new movie that he is making. Ralph played Train 45 in this movie. I haven't got all the details as to when the

movie will be out yet but as soon as Ralph lets me know I'll pass the information on to you. It would be worth a ticket just to hear Ralph play that five.

Ralph will be traveling back out west in April to do a yet another special project with Dwight Yoakam. Dwight is making a another movie and Ralph Stanley, yes Ralph Stanley will be in this movie with Dwight. I will keep you up to date as what will happen with this project.

Our beloved leader, Ralph Stanley, will be making a appearance on May 5th, along with Dwight Yoakam on the Dick Clark Show. Keep your eyes and ears peeled for this one.

STANLEY ON THE AID

KDEO of Hawaii that plays Country Music has been giving Ralph's Saturday Night - Sunday Morning a lot of air play. Thanks!

KMOX Radio, in St. Louis, Mo. had Ralph in for an live interview Feb. 25th. This is one of the largest Radio stations around, and can be heard in a morjority of the country. They talked about his new album Saturday Night

-Sunday Morning and play a few of the cuts off of this great collection. They opened telephone lines for people to call in and talk to Ralph and they had a terrific response.

John Wright, author of Traveling The Highway Home - Ralph Stanley and The World of Traditional Music, was on "Extension 720" WGN Chicago, on Jan. 21st talking about his book and Ralph Stanley. It was a very interesting 2 hours of facts and music.

ADTICLE NEWS

USA Today Jan 7th listed all the Grammy Awards nominees and they listed Ralph in the Vocal Collaboration. Besides Ralph and Dwight their were Reba McEntire and Vince Gill, Clint Black and Wynonna Judd, Reba and Linda Davis and a couple more. But we know who the best is don't we!

On February 2,1994 the San Francisco Bay Guardian had a excellent write up on Ralph Stanley. This article was written by Kurt Wolff. He talks about Ralph with great pride and respect. He tells of a man who does not bragg about himself but that is proud of his voice and haunting tenor which had been called the "high lone some singing". I quote him as saying "Ralph Stanley may not be the "father of bluegrass" as bandleader Bill Monroe is known. But he has, both with his brother Carter (who died in 1966) and

on his own, earned his place in the pantheon, thanks not only to his voice but to his unwavering love of the mountain music he grew up with and made his own".

He tells of Ralph and Carter musical career, their first recordings and how they survived the onslot on Rock and Roll.

He then tells of Ralph's Saturday Night - Sunday Morning album and of Ralph's Grammy nomination.

CONCERT NEWS

Ralph has been a very busy fellow these past few months. Here are some highlights on some of the shows. Before I get to far into these I want to thank all of the fan club members who send in these reports. It makes the rest of us feel like we were there.

Ralph performed at the Paradise Theater in Kansas City, Mo. Feb 25th. From what I told it was a packed house with Ralph playing some of the his best music. Ralph and the Clinch Mt. Boys were also spotted at the Henry the VIII Hotel in St. Louis, Mo. playing the indoor bluegrass festival there. While there he brought the house down with his exquisite banjo playing, and his singing of the lonesome mountain sound. The best in Mountain Music, boy what a treat for those people in the Show Me State of Missouri.

STANLEY BANJOS

Ralph still has a few of the 40th Anniversary Banjos for

BANJO VIDEO

Smithsonian/Folkways has produced a video called THE BANJO OF RALPH STANLEY taught by Ralph himself. This tape starts with the first tunes that Ralph learned from his mother in the old time clawhammer style. There are about three different clawhammer styles that he shows us. Ralph also shows us the two finger that he learned and also the three finger style that he now plays. This is not just and instructional tape, it is full of great music too. Some of the tunes on the tape, along with the Clinch Mt. Boys, with-Ralph Stanley II, are Little Maggie, Hard Times, Dickenson County Breakdown, Little Birdie, Shout Little Lulie, Clinch Mountain Backstep, Train 45 and many more. This is a 90 minute tape of classic Stanley Music. If you are a banjo

picker like me you definitely want to get one of these. If not you still will want one of these in your video library. The music alone is worth the cost of the tape. It's not often that you get to see Ralph on tape playing that great Mountain music that he made famous. Boys the line up will be Charlie Sizemore, Traditional Grass, Jimmy Martin, Larry Sparks and Bill Monroe to name a few. The dates this year will be May 26-27-28. There will be plenty of parking lot pickin', I should say pasture pickin' and great, great music with Ralph and his guests. There are plenty of area motels in case you don't want to camp at the festival site. But for all you people who do like to camp there are hookups available on a first come first serve basis. Be sure to bring your lawn chairs to sit under the shed out in front of the stage to keep you out of the rain

and the sun. The family graveyard will be open so you can see where Ralph and Carter's mother, Lucy Stanley and also Carter are laid to rest. I also think that the old stage down in the holler will be open to see where Ralph and The Clinch Mountain Boys made some great music also before the new stage was built. There will be sign directing you to the festival site plus there will be a handbill included in the newsletter telling you how to get there from Coeburn or McClure. This is the best festival ever - YA'LL COME!

RALPH STANLEY BOOK

Ralph's new book, Traveling The High Way Home-Ralph Stanley and the World of Traditional Bluegrass Music, written by John Wright is now available to purchase from Ralph Stanley. This is an excellent book about Ralph and his many years in music. Told by some of his closet friends, coworkers, and sidemen, they tell about some of their fondest memories and experiences with this great man. There is a 32 page section that Ralph talks about himself from the time of his early childhood to the late

NEW CD

As most of you know Ralph did a Masters of The Banjo tour back in late October. This tour was organized by the National Council for the Traditional Arts. Well the people at Arhoolie Productions make a CD of these performances. It is a collection of different banjo styles, such as Bluegrass, Clawhammer, two-finger, Appalachian melodic, African banjo to name a few. Ralph Stanley is on this collection with his versatile banjo styles and his "high lonesome sound" that he has made famous. His recordings on the CD are Nobody's Love Is Like Mine, I Just Think I'll Go Away, Children Go Where I Send Thee, which by the way is a cappella that no one but Ralph can do best. Ralph also does his best in clawhammer-I Got A Mule To Ride, Rocky Island and Shout Little Lulie. Ralph is in top form with an excellent job of singing and playing banjo with Laurie Lewis on fiddle and vocals and Dudley Connell on guitar and vocals.

Along with Ralph on the CD are other banjo players with their unique style of playing.

Seleshe Damessae, Kirk Sutphin, Tony Ellis, Seamus Egan, Carroll Best and Will Keys. Anything with Ralph Stanley on it is a must have for the serious Stanley Music collector. This makes it nice to have also if you missed these fine performances, it's almost like being there.
