



Well here it is festival season again - so for all you pickers get out those instruments and string 'em up, get your fingers lose, get your voice right and head out to see the great Dr. Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mt. Boys play at an outdoor festival. And lets don't forget those faithful listeners cause we couldn't do without them. So ya'll get your chairs out - the food and cold drinks and head out to support the Ralph and the boys too!

Ralph and The Clinch Mt. Boys have been pretty busy the last couple of months - seems like they're more on the road than at home. It's a part of a tough musicians life - but we sure are glad that we have them to listen to.

ARTICLE NEWS

Ralph's been getting a lot of interesting write-ups in different publications in the last couple of months and there's many more to come. The best one was in the March 8th issue of Newsweek A whole page was dedicated to Ralph and Carter and it was an excellent article. Newsweek states the Stanley's were the rawest, most mountain sounding of the 1st generation Bluegrass bands, and it was Ralph's piercing tenor and hard driving banjo that gave them their cutting edge. Newsweek also states Ralph the most revered figure in the world of bluegrass. Newsweek calls Saturday Night - Sunday Morning an

autumnal masterpiece by an American master. How true that is! Now that's a hard statement to beat.

Richmond Times - Dispatch had a nice write up on Ralph in their Feb. 28th paper (thanks to Dick Freeland for sending me a copy). It talks about when Ralph and Carter first started out in music in 1946 up to the present. Then it moves on to the new double CD Saturday Night - Sunday Moming telling how Country Artists like Vince Gill Patty Loveless, Emmylou Harris, Ricky Skaggs, Dwight Yoakam and other country and bluegrass artist jumped at the chance to record with an artist they consider a hero.

Music City News will also be doing a write-up on Ralph and the new double CD in the next few issues.

WAMU Radio in the Washington DC area had a great write up on Ralph also in their program guide March/April 1993. WAMU sponsored the bluegrass concert in Fairfax, VA at the Fairfax High School April 3rd. It also talked of Ralph and Carter in the early days and told about the new double CD.

One of our newest fan club members, Joy Aurigemma, of Allentown, NJ, writes for a country music magazine called Country Music News. In April's issue she did a excellent article on Ralph Stanley and the Clinch Mt. Boys. Thanks Joy! The Washington Post had a excellent, make that triple excellent article on Ralph Stanley March 20th. It tells of Ralph's life throughout his musical career. When reading this article one can see a side of the man that very few know. Ken Ringie (the man who wrote the article) states that Bill Monroe may be the father of bluegrass music, and Earl Scruggs its most famous son, but Ralph Stanley is surely its high priest.

STANLEY ON THE AIR

PBS (Public Broadcasting Station) radio did an interview with Ralph April 5th that will be aired sometime in the next month or so. Be sure to listen for it.

how the project came to be and

Ralph and Hairl discussed on how Ralph and Carter got started in Bristol, Va. on Farm and Fun Radio show. They also talked about Ralph and Carter's first TV show in 1949 on WSAZ in Huntington, WV and the early 60's for a TV show in Florida.

The next cut Hairl did was the one with Ralph, Emmylou Harris, and Judy Marshall, "Old Man's Tears". Ralph and Hairl also discussed the new single release with Ralph and Tom T. Hall - "Water Lilly". "First Step To Heaven" was next and "Angel Band" was after that. Hairl ended the set with a classic cut form the King Label days with Ralph and Carter - "Train 45" with Ralph's piercing, driving banjo.

Seems like to me this double CD is destine to be one of the best bluegrass albums out. It's getting excellent reviews and everyone that's heard it's has raved about it. So if you haven't gotten one of these be sure to put it on your list of things to buy. You can also purchase it through the fan club or you can buy it from Ralph where he's playing, and they're going fast. You can also check out your local record stores also. Special note Ralph and the Clinch Mt. Boys were back in the studio the first weekend in April. They are working on a couple of new projects. We'll just have to wait and see what the Master of Bluegrass turns out next.

Bluegrass Unlimited had a excellent review in the Highlight section of the Record review. The name of the CD was THE STANLEY BROTHERS STANLEY SERIES - Vol. 3, No.4. This recording is from the live performance at Rising Sun, Md - Sept. 7, 1958. I have this CD and it is really great. Ralph also has these to sell so be sure to pick one of these up also.

Ralph and the boys did a show in Thompkinsville, Ky on the 10th of April and it was a terrific turn out.

Mitchell Van Dyke was a special guest with Ralph that night. Mitchell was the man who filled in for Ralph playing banjo when he was out for surgery. Mitch did a banjo tune and even filled in on bass for Jack Cooke while he was out on personal business. From what Mitchell's mother said it was his first time ever played bass, but Mitch being

Ralph put on 3 outstanding shows with great harmony and excellent music. Everyone was commenting on it was the best they had ever seen him do

Charlie Sizemore stopped by to sing "Little Bessie" with Ralph. Bill Monroe popped in for a few minutes to do a couple with Ralph. "On My Way Back To The Old Home" and "Sweetheart of Mine".

Shelton Feazell, that sang bass with Ralph on the "Back To The Cross" album, was also called up on stage to do a few also. "Go Tell It On The Mountain" which by the way Ralph did an excellent job of re-writing and arranging this song, " and Praise His Name". Art Stamper was also there with his fine fiddle work to twin fiddle with Curly Ray.

For the 2nd show Curly Ray and Art Stamper were both late for this one. I think this makes 21 for Ray and 1 for Art. Ralph & The Clinch Mt. Boys did our favorite songs such as "It Takes A Worried Man", "Room At The Top Of The Stairs" and "Little

Maggie". Also they did some fine cappella singing which I always look forward to. No one in the business can do this kind of singing as well as Ralph does. He puts so much feeling into it and puts it across in such a way that it will make anyone think twice about which direction their life is going. "Willing To Try" and "Children Go" were a couple that Ralph did. Also "White Oak On The Hill", which is my favorite, finished the gospel part out. Ralph finished the set out with a few request like "Gold Watch & Chain", "Rank Strangers", "Who Will Call You Sweetheart" and "Walk Softly On This Heart Of Mine".

The 3rd set was an all request show too. "Katy Daley", "All I Ever Loved Was You", "No One's Love Is Like Mine" and many more. Ralph ended the set with his famous clawhammer specials. "Mule To Ride", Rocky Island" and Shout Little Lulie". All in all it was the greatest show and Ralph really outdid himself. It takes a strong leader to keep a band tight and together and Ralph is the best at it. Thanks for a wonderful show.

Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mt. Boys appeared at Shepherdsville, Ky at the Shepherdsville Music Barn. They were joined by Larry Sparks and The Goins Brothers, and as always it has been reported that Ralph put on an outstanding show.

Art Stamper, who is from around there was also twin

fiddling with Curly Ray. The crowd was good and they were ready for Ralph to give them a great show and that's what they got. They are big supporters of Ralph.

Ralph finished up the set with everyone coming out and doing a number of two with him. What a way to end a night - good singing and music with the Master of Bluegrass Ralph Stanley. Kentucky salutes you Ralph!


