The weather was perfect and there was no rain during the whole festival with the temperature was in the 70's to low 80's. That's two May's in a row that the rain did not fall. It was a great turnout with a wonderful big crowd.

The Thursday Night crowd was the biggest ever for a week night. Shiloh Mt. Trio was on hand with Mitchell Van Dyke to do a great show that night. Thanks to Gary & Anita with Verlin Sanders, and Rick Phillips for providing us with good music. To make a perfect evening even more exciting was when Ralph Stanley and the Clinch Mt. Boys hit the stage. The crowd had been waiting all night for the best in bluegrass music Ralph gave them what they came for. Ralph and the boys wore jeans and dress shirts with an exception of Curly Ray and Jack Cooke to go along with the relax atmosphere. Curly Ray was even sporting a new suit to go along for the occasion. That's something that you only see on Smith Ridge.

Ralph and the Clinch Mt. Boys were in excellent form and harmony. They did all our favorites with Ralph II doing extra singing for us this year. He's really coming along great. Ralph II new songs are "Down Where The River Bends, "Finger Popping Time", and he even sang bass on "Will You Miss Me". Keep it up II you're doing a great job.

Ralph was dazzling the crowd with his expert banjo picking and great singing. No one can do it like Ralph. That lonesome tenor singing and excellent lead singing no one can copy. He is the best in the business.

Little Amber (Ralph's granddaughter) was even singing on stage with her Papaw. She showed no stage fright - she just walked right up and stood next to Ralph and opened her mouth and let it go and the crowd loved it. Even Nathan (Ralph's grandson) was on stage with him one night. Four Stanley's on stage at one time what a tradition. Who knows we might have three generations of Stanley's in the music business.

The Friday night crowd was really great. Raymond Fairchild did an great job with his fancy banjo work along with Bill Monroe and The Bluegrass Boys who put on a good show. Then the best was yet to come. Ralph and the boys hit the stage and the crowd went wild. Once again Ralph and the Clinch Mt. Boys were in fine form and did some excellent singing and playing and did quite a few requests on the last show. All the boys did a great job with their pickin' and singin' and Ralph made them holler for more with his singin' and banjo playing - especially with

his clawhammer pickin. Even Art Stamper was on hand to play with them this time. He and Curly Ray make a great team twin fiddling.

The Saturday night show was the best I've seen. Larry Sparks and The Lonesome Ramblers did an outstanding show along with the Goins Brothers and The Bluegrass Strangers. Jeanie Stanley brought in her group and did a couple of shows also. Jeanie is the daughter of Carter Stanley, for the ones who missed the last newsletter.

Ralph and the Clinch Mt. Boys did 2 extortionary shows (they never let us down) even though Raiph and Raiph II were hoarse. Jack Cooke filled in on tenor for Ralph. You can really tell when Ralph's not singing. He has an irreplaceable voice that cannot be substituted. I don't think there is another person in the business that can get the lonesome sound that Ralph can. You have to feel and to do it and he does just that. The boys do an excellent job but it's Ralph that holds the band together with that great Stanley Sound. His voice is a clean and pure as the mountain air. The heart and soul of the mountains and Mountain Music.

Jr. sang "Mary Ann" for us, and did a great job. Jack sang for us, as well as Ernie doing his excellent lead singing. Ralph II picked and sang for us and Curly Ray and Art Stamper played some excellent twin fiddles. Ralph once again kept the crowd screaming for more with his hard driving banjo.

#### OTHER CONCERTS

Ralph reports that the Otter Creek Park festival in Fort Knox was a fairly good crowd for the first year of this bluegrass festival. This was the first year for this bluegrass show. The weather was a little warm but it was still a nice turnout. Ralph still was not able to sing during this trip but he dazzled them with his banjo work. No one can play banjo like Ralph. Jack and Ernie did a fine job of filling in for Ralph while he was recuperating from laryngitis.

April 29th Ralph played at Whitesburg, Ky and it was a great turnout. Ralph II sang "Going Up Home To Live In Green Pastures" with his dad and it went over really well.

Ralph Stanley and the Clinch Mountains Boys were back in Nashville, June 7 for the Bluegrass portion of Fan Fair. They started with "Mountain Folks" and the crowd really loved it. Ricky Skaggs joined Ralph on the stage next and did "Lonesome" and "All I Ever Loved Was You". Ralph ended his part of the show with "Sally Goodwin", with Ralph receiving the largest hand and he did an outstanding job. Ralph II was along with him on this trip also.

Along with Ralph on this show were Charlie Sizemore, Alison Krauss, Bluegrass Cardinals, Lynn Morris, Nashville, Bluegrass Band, Doyle Lawson, Jim & Jesse, Bill Monroe, and others. At the grand finale Bill Monroe called everyone out on stage to do a number or two, "I'll Fly Away", and "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot".

#### ARTICLE NEWS

New York Times had a great article on Ralph May 2nd. It was written by Billy Altman and he stated that Bill Monroe may be the Father of Bluegrass, then 66 year old banjo player and singer Ralph Stanley must be it's soul. He also states that Saturday Night - Sunday Morning is recommended to anyone interested in Bluegrass

or authentic sounds of traditional Country Music.

New York Times says he has been a teacher and living legend to the many sidemen that have gone through Bluegrass Boot Camp under his direction.

The article moved on to talk about the new CD and for how some of the guests it was a reunion and for others it was a side that most of them never get to share when singing their kind of music.

Billy also writes that Ralph's Idiosyncratic (one's own) harmonies and perfectly play instrumental runs that elevate each of these performances to a higher esthetic ground.

Smithsonian/Folkwa;ys has produced a video called THE BANJO OF RALPH STANLEYtaught by Ralph Stanley himself. This tape starts with the first tunes that Ralph learned from his mother in the old-time clawhammer style. There are about three different clawhammer styles that he shows us. Ralph also shows us his two finger style, then to the popular three finger style that Ralph now plays. This is not just an instructional tape, it is full of great music too. Some of the tunes on the tape, along

with the Clinch Mt. Boys - even Ralph II is helping on a few of these - are Little Maggie, Hard Times, Dickenson County Breakdown, Little Birdie, Shout Little Lulie, Clinch Mountain Backstep, Train 45 and many many more. This is a 90 minute tape of classic Stanley Music. If you are a banjo picker like me you definitely want to get one of these. If not you still will want one of these in your video library. The music alone is worth the cost of the tape. It's not often that you get to see Ralph on tape playing that great Mountain music that he make famous. One time little Ralph and Jr. went fishing up on John Flaningon Lake. It was in Jan. and the wind was blowing hard and it was real cold. Little Ralph was in the back of the boat and Jr. was running the trolling motor and he hooked this fish. While Jr. was trying to get this fish into the boat he looked back and told Little Ralph to hand him the net. When he turned back around to get the fish his feet got hung up in the trolling motor cable and he fell out of the boat into that cold water. Little Ralph threw out the life ring to Jr. and reeled him in like a big fish. Jr. lost his fishing pole and everything. Ralph got him back into the boat and wrapped him in a quilt then Ralph drove the boat over to the bank and started a fire to thaw Jr. out. He loaned him a pair of coveralls and a raincoat to keep him warm. Jr. was about froze to death. Traveling The High Way Home, Ralph Stanley and the Word of Traditional Bluegrass Music, is a musician in his own right. Wright has a new cassette out on the market now call Everything She Asks For. It is a great collection of Bluegrass favorites with John Wright playing in the old clawhammer style and singing lead. He is joined by Clinch Mt. Boys, Curly Ray Cline on fiddle, and Jr. Blankenship on guitar and singing tenor on the vocals. Two of my favorites are "Last Day In The Life Of Carter Stanley" and Brand New Tennessee Waltz".

Other songs are Everything she Asks For- Lets Talk For a While - Highway Of Sorrow - Funny When You Feel That Way - Dirty Dishes - I Get So Cold - Too Old To Die Young - The Children are Crying-Gravel Road- No Hiding Place and Shall We Gather At The River.

A special hello to Tonya, Nathan, Lisa, Amber, Ralph II, Mike Cheek, and Jimmi! take care till I see you again!




