Later on that night Ralph performed at the Awards Show and for his song he performed Mountain Folks, which is an excellent choice and one of my favorites.

About a 3rd of the way into the Awards Show the winner

of the IBMA's Recorded Event of the Year was awarded to Ralph Stanley for the Saturday Night - Sunday Morning album. There is not a better man in the business that deserves it better. FESTIVAL NEWS

Faye and Homer Elam, who have been friends with Ralph for many years reports that the Roundeye Park festival in Painter's Creek, OH. August 21st was a great success. Ralph and The Clinch Mt. Boys stopped by their house for a nice visit and rest the night before going out to the festival the following day.

They weather was really nice and the crowd was good. Ralph and The Clinch Mt. Boys put on two great shows to a very receptive crowd.

Nestled in the Smokie Mountains just over the Tennesee border is a little town called Cherokee, NC. That is where the Ralph Stanley bus was spotted playing a festival there on August 26th.

Ralph's first set was filled with all our Stanley favorites like "Room At The Top Of The Stairs", "Mt. Folks", "Who Will Call You Sweetheart", and many, many others. The gospel part was outstanding as only Ralph Stanley can do. That old mountain harmony singing is hard to beat and

Ralph is the best at it.

Ralph's second show was full of requests like "Rank Stranger", "Take Me Home Tonight In A Song", "Man Of Constant Sorrow", and many other fine tunes. He finished the set out with his famous clawhammer tunes that drove the crowd wild.

Another member was found traveling with Ralph on two more festival this summer.

Friday Sept. 3rd found Ralph Stanley & The Clinch Mountain Boys at the Salem County Fair Grounds, Woodstown, NJ, site of the 22nd Annual Delaware Valley Bluegrass Festival. Ralph was scheduled for only one mid-evening 40 minute show. The first day crowd was a bit on the small side, but as Ralph's 9:15 appearance time drew near the crowd became larger. Ralph and The Boys led off with "Cotton Eyed Joe" and the crowd got into it. The group received enthusiastic applause as each selection was very well received by the audience.

Immediately after the show Ralph and The Boys boarded the bus and headed west toward West Virginia and the

next days show.

The temperature on Sat. Sept. 4th was much cooler and more pleasant that the previous day as The Ralph Stanley Bus arrived at Aunt Minnie's Farm near Stumptown, WV. Ralph was scheduled for 2 shows that day at 4 and 11pm. The turn out was fair for an early Saturday afternoon. There had been quite a bit of heavy

rain overnight and into the early morning and the grounds were muddy.

The crowd had grown some by 4pm and the first show went very well. Tape sales were brisk with Ralph providing many autographs for young and old alike.

The crowd was much larger by second show time. Ralph and The Boys gave a memorable performance and went several minutes over the allotted time to satisfy the crowds wishes. Then it was back on the Bus and headed for home after a job well done.

Ralph and The Clinch Mt. Boys were yet spotted at another festival. This time it was the Poppy Mt. Bluegrass Festival in Morehead, Ky. on Saturday, 18th. This place is set up on a large Mt. with lots of acreage with plenty to do besides listing to music. Hay rides, horseback riding, and fishing.

The majority of the crowd turned out to see Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mt. Boys perform and they got what they wanted. Ralph and the boys were in fine form and they put on 2 excellent shows. "White Oak On The Hill", "Room At The Top Of The Stairs", "Pretty Polly", and "Little Maggie" to name a few of the songs. Ralph was dazzling them with his exquisite banjo playing (like no one but Ralph can do), and excellent mountain singing. They boys were doing their favorites in singing and playing. Ralph and the boys were in perfect tune with the wonderful harmony singing in

the gospel as well as the standard songs. Ralph and The Clinch Mt. Boys were the only group during the whole afternoon and evening shows that was called out for an encore. Now that's what I call knowing who you want.

In between shows Ralph was spotted taking a buggy ride with Melvin Goins taking a tour around the festival grounds. See! you have to keep your eyes open, you never know what you might see!

Ralph was kept busy signing autographs and spending time talking to all his fans that turned out to see him. After the final show it was off to yet another bluegrass show in another part of the country.

Once again our fan club members spotted the Stanley Bus in the foothills of the Smokies. This time at Maggie Valley, NC October the 8th. Ralph performed at the Maggie Valley Opry House, which from what I understand is the brainchild of Raymond Fairchild. Ralph & The Clinch Mountain Boys performed to a standing room only crowd with the crowd getting more than they expected.

Ralph and the boys did a excellent show with all the Stanley favorites like, "Cotton Eyed Joe", "Carolina Mountain" and many, many more. Ralph and Ralph II kept them begging for more with "Just Because" and "Down Where The River Bends". The crowd was extremely delighted when Ralph stepped

up to the mike and showed off his clawhammer pickin".

Raymond Fairchild also came upon the stage to do a couple of numbers with Ralph also. "Molly and Tenbrooks" and "White House Blues".

The Stanley Bus also make it's way to Blue Ridge, Ga. October the 9th to put on a terrific show at Sugar Creek Park. From what I am told this too was a great show and the people really had a great time. Once again Ralph really outdid himself for the people and they showed how much they enjoyed his singing and playing for them. They really comment on his gospel singing. It's the best they've ever heard.

Ralph Stanley & The Clinch Mt. Boys performed at the Grand Ole Opry House in Nashville, Tn. October 15th. They were performing on the Early Bird Bluegrass Show that is held every year during Country Music Month in Nashville. Ralph also was performing along with Ricky Skaggs Picking Party at the Grand Palace Theater in Branson, MO. October 17th. From what Ralph said it is a beautiful place that holds about 4500 people. He played 2 shows there to a great crowd, and even got together with Ricky Skaggs to do a few numbers like old times. I'm glad to see that so many of our fan club members turn out for these shows and that they send me these reports and pictures to share with all of us in the club. It's almost like being there.

ADTICLE NEWS

The September 23rd issue of The Wall Street Journal and a fantastic write-up on Ralph and the Saturday Night - Sunday Morning project. It was written by Nat Hentoff who is a writer and jazz critic in New York. He states in his column "Ralph Stanley is a subtly resourceful banjo picker, Stanley's singing had been described by Bill Malone - the premiere historian of these forms - as one of the most unmistakable rural

voices in country music - a haunting, almost sepulchral voice." He goes on to tell about the Stanley Bro. and then on to Ralph and the CD. He discusses some of material on the CD like "Heaven's Bright Shore", "Banks Of The Ohio", to name a few, and his feelings on them. He tells how all the singers on the album pay Ralph tribute by the integrity of their won music. The whole column was done very nicely and in very good taste.

Ralph's new book Traveling The Highway Home - Ralph Stanley and The World of Traditional Music by John Wright is now available. I have included in this newsletter where you can get this book. Ordering information will be on the back cover of the newsletter. I have read this book and John has done a great job in bringing it all together. This is a must have reading material. It is also filled with some great pictures. Be sure to put this on your list also with the new CD/Tape to buy for the long cold winter. What better way to spend the winter listening to Raiph Stanley on the stereo and reading all about this great and wonderful man.

STANLEY BANJOS

Ralph still has a few of the 40th Anniversary Banjos for sale. I think that 5 have been sold already. These are a high quality banjo designed and crafted by Frank Neat. They have that Stanley Sound

that you can't find in any other banjo. They are gold plated with engraving on the arm rest and on the flange of the banjo. They have Ralph's name on the headstock and 40th Anniversary on the fingerboard. They are really a collectors item. BANJO VIDEO

Smithsonian/Folkways has produced a video called THE BANJO OF RALPH STANLEY taught by Ralph himself. This tape starts with the first tunes that Ralph learned from his mother in the old time clawhammer style. There are about three different clawhammer styles that he shows us. Raiph also shows us his two finger style, that Ralph now plays. This is not just an instructional tape, it is full of great music too. Some of the tunes on the tape, along with the Clinch Mt. Boys- even Ralph II is helping on a few of these - are Little Maggie, Hard Times, Dickenson County Breakdown, Little Birdie, Shout Little Lulie, Clinch Mountain Backstep, Train 45 and many many more. This is a 90 minute tape of classic Stanley Music. If you are a banjo picker like me you definitely want to get one of these. If not you still will want one of these in your video library. The music alone is worth the cost of the tape. It's not often that you get to see

Ralph on tape playing that great Mountain music that he make famous. Ralph will be selling these on the road and you can also purchase one through Ralph at this address: Ralph Stanley, RT HCO5, Box 576, Coeburn, VA 24230. 


Congratulations to Lisa (Ralph's oldest daughter) and Brian Marshall. They were married on August 13th at Ralph's home. We wish them many happy years together.


